St. Julie Billiart Parish

Dear Parishioners

Let me begin this New Year by assuring you that I pray that this year will be a year of grace and favor for you and for our parish. This is a Jubilee Year for the Church Universal and for our sister St. Peter Parish which is celebrating its 150th anniversary as a parish.

The word Jubilee comes from a Hebrew word meaning "horn." The third book of the Bible, Leviticus, states that every 50th year the horn would be sounded, and God's people would begin celebrating a special year of favor from the Lord. Debts would be cancelled. Slaves would be freed. People would return to their ancestral heritage. It was sort of a "reset" for everyone. The Jubilee Year would be commenced with the blowing of the horn.

Though this Jubilee "reset" is referred to in the Leviticus 25, the historical books of the bible give no historical description of how this was practiced in the history of Israel. However, the Church Universal picked up this practice in the year 1300 AD. The focus was and is on spiritual debts, Jubilee Years were times of forgiveness and reconciliation as well as release from temporal punishment due to sin.

What initially began as every 50 years was reduced to every 25 years. Other occasions have led to special Holy Years being convoked, such as the 1933 Jubilee of Redemption and the 2016 Jubilee of Mercy.

St. Peter Parish will be joining in this Universal Jubilee Year with its own celebration of 150 Years of parish life. We will do so in a variety of ways, beginning this weekend when Mayor Corcoran reads a Proclamation on behalf of the North Ridgeville City Council as part of our Epiphany Mass at 4:00 p.m.

There are other events happening this year that make it a special time of grace for us. As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, Bishop Malesic has written a pastoral letter to the people of God in the Diocese of Cleveland entitled <u>A Flourishing Apostolic Church</u>. This letter is very readable and practical. Bishop Malesic calls each individual to deepen their friendship with the Lord through prayer. He also calls each parish to grow in its Worship of the Lord, Evangelization, and Service of the Needy. He is encouraging parish staff, parish councils, and parish faith sharing groups to prayerfully read and discuss this letter. Copies of this 24-page letter are at the doors of the church.

The Epiphany of the Lord

Finally, as I mentioned a few weeks ago, I met with a number of parishioners to revise the parish mission and vision statements for St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes. After gathering ideas from both parish councils, we developed a simple and easily remembered statement:

Knowing Christ + Loving Christ + Serving Christ Together

We will be looking at the pastoral mission of St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes through the lens of this statement. Our desire is to become a local expression of Bishop Malesic's letter: A Flourishing Apostolic Church.

These three things-the Jubilee Year, Bishop Malesic's pastoral letter, and our new parish vision statement-will provide the inspiration for growing our parishes pastoral work in North Ridgeville and beyond.

With Magi, representatives of the whole world, let us offer to the Newborn King our gifts. We want to acknowledge Jesus Christ as King and God and Sacrifice!



Ukraine Welcome Circle Updates


