Dear Parishioner,

Winter is back. Though I know that weather can change on a dime, I still like to check out the long-range forecast. The first report of a day 40 degrees or more was the second weekend in February! May the Lord help us to face the cold and embrace the weather he gives us.

During this first full week of January, I met with the parish councils of both St. Julie and St. Peter Parishes. Among other things I gave both parish councils (as well as the staff members and finance councils of both parishes) homework! I am asking them to read over Bishop Malesic's Pastoral Letter A Flourishing Apostolic Church. After we read the letter, we will discuss it. It is my desire that each of our parishes become flourishing, apostolic parishes, knowing Christ, loving Christ, and serving Christ Together.

Today's Feast is the Baptism of the Lord. In many ways, this feast is the perfect segue into Ordinary Time and our focus in the ministry and teachings of Jesus public life. Like last week's feast, Epiphany, this event reveals who Jesus is-the beloved Son of the Father. It also highlights who God is, for we see the Son of God made flesh, hear the voice of the Father, and see the presence of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove. The Baptism of the Lord also gives insight into the plan of God.

God's plan is to make all things new (see Revelation 21:5). Genesis 6: 5-9:28 tells the story of Noah and the great flood. As the waters recede from the flood, Noah eventually releases a dove. It returned to the ark after a day. The second time he released it, it returned with an olive branch. The third time he released the dove, it did not return.

The fact that the dove returned with an olive branch indicated to Noah and his family that the earth was cleansed and starting over. This was God's plans-to cleanse the world of evil and make it new.

Christians, because they are baptized, are to be living signs of this coming new world. St. Paul said, So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away: behold, new things have come. (2 Corinthians 5:17) Our baptism frees us from sin and empowers us to live a holy way of life. This is our call. Unfortunately, many of us forget who we really are and embrace a manner of life that is opposed to God's call in Christ.

The Baptism of the Lord

By the power of the Holy Spirit, we want to embrace a manner of life befitting a new creation in Christ. As the waters of Noah's time cleansed the earth and gave it a new beginning, so the waters of baptism have freed us from the bondages of sin and given us a new start, with new power, new purpose, and new peace. And if we are not living in the liberty Christ has won for us, let us seek it afresh in the Sacrament of Penance. This gift of God's mercy refreshes the baptized with forgiveness and a fresh start. In God's eyes, it is never too late to start over. And since we do not know the day or the hour of the Lord's return, let us not put off starting afresh!
