

# 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Dear Parishioner

I participated in two important events last week. The first one I would call inspiring. Fr. Andrew Hoover, former parochial vicar, was installed as the pastor of St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Parma last Saturday. He has been the administrator of the parish for one year. He is now officially installed as pastor. Congratulations and let us keep him in our prayers as he continues to serve God's people in Parma.

The second event I would describe as alarming. Fr. Allen Hoffa of the Diocese of Allentown, PA, put on a workshop on the pervasiveness and harmful effects of Pornography. Gathering best practices from Integrity Restored and other reputable organizations, he accurately and with clinical precision described this scourge of our time and pointed to avenues of healing and hope. Fr. Hoffa gave us materials to educate and equip the people we serve.

I am interested in developing a plan to educate and equip parents and students (in an age-appropriate manner) on this pervasive problem. I will be calling on some people to assist in the development of this plan. Please keep this in your prayers also.

In addition to the Mass and sacraments, I am grateful for the many ways that our parishes offer programs to help people grow in their faith. When I stand at the pulpit at St. Peter Parish, I can read the scripture quote on the back arch: Simon, lovest thou Me? Feed My sheep. These programs are meant to feed and strengthen our walk with the Lord.

Some programs that are on the immediate horizon include the one offered to Parents of Pre-K to Grade 2 video series overseen by Deacon Del and Niki Sherman (at St. Julie Parish), and the Bereavement Program (at St. Peter Parish). Please check this bulletin and the parish websites for more information.

Other upcoming programs include the No Greater Love Book Study/Video Series, the repeat of the National Eucharistic Congress one day mini-retreat (March 22) and the three-week discussion study of the Bishop's Pastoral Letter a Flourishing Apostolic Church (March/April).

I have just mentioned some of the ways that we are spiritually fed in addition to the Eucharist. We need to remember that we are fed by the Lord so that we can live our faith robustly for the Lord. And one way we are called to do that is to participate in the Annual Catholic Charities Appeal. This is Appeal Weekend. Many of you have already made your pledge through the mail appeal that was conducted in late January/early February. THANK YOU! However, others have not made a pledge or given a gift. I ask you, as you are able, to support this campaign that assists so many others. Catholic Charities assists people with basic needs, mental health needs, people who are physically and developmentally handicapped, and even our student athletes through CYO. I encourage your generosity. Catholic Charities seeks to be the hands and feet of Christ, doing corporal works of mercy. More than simply giving a handout, they give a hand up, elevating the dignity of a human person.

This week's readings remind us of where we find true life: in the Lord. Apart from Christ, we are in a spiritual desert. With Christ, we are planted by the streams of grace. This means that we must seek the blessings that come from being humble, simple, hungry, and hidden. If we seek our comfort and reputation more than seeking to bless others, we will end up in a desert of woes. Let us seek the true blessings of Christ. Though they seem the opposite of what the world offers, they lead us to the Kingdom of God, where there is no fear of loss but only the fullness of joy.

# Our Ukrainian Welcome Circle and the Bryiovskyis need your help!

There have been a number of Executive Orders in the last week or so addressing Immigration. UWC Members have been in these Zoom meetings as legal representatives of the United States Council of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) have provided insights into the impact of the Executive Orders. They also provided guidance regarding what information to share with our families. They also have provided recommendations about how to share. We have met with the Bryiovskyis and reviewed in detail everything we have so far. What they had heard made them fearful and the meeting helped to lessen some of that fear. We will continue to follow all updates and proceed as recommended. This is the short summary.

Even though the Bryiovskyis came to the US legally under Humanitarian Parole, some of the proposed changes to Immigration could put their legal status in jeopardy. Our family is currently working with an immigration lawyer to find options as are many of the other families who came to northeast Ohio sponsored by other parishes.

So, how can we best serve them? Pray that the Bryiovskyis can stay for the full term for which they were approved. Watch your email or go to our website to contact your political representatives with three easy clicks! St. Julie's Website:

#### Ukraine Welcome Circle Updates

Everyone is doing fine. Susiana turned 4 and they had a great Christmas, thanks to all of the donations we received. They were able to spend some time with Vitalii's brother and his family as well as Nadiia's sister and her family.

This week Vitalii took the test to get his learner permit for CDL (truck driving). He passed! This is the first step to get him into CDL training. Now he will be able to apply for the full training course. So, Vitalii is now "negotiating with his boss" to take time off to complete the training. He's hoping to start soon. The process will likely take 2-3 months.

Now that our new administration is in office, we will need to keep a close eye on any changes to immigration policies as they relate to the program under which the Bryiovskyis came.

"I would now like to say a special word to women who have had an abortion. The Church is aware of the many factors which may have influenced your decision, and she does not doubt that in many cases it was a painful and even shattering decision. The wound in your heart may not yet have healed. Certainly what happened was and remains terribly wrong. But do not give in to discouragement and do not lose hope. Try rather to understand what happened and face it honestly. If you have not already done so, give yourselves over with humility and trust to repentance. The Father of mercies is ready to give you his forgiveness and his peace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. To the same Father and to his mercy you can with sure hope entrust your child." (Pope St. John Paul II, The Gospel of Life, #99)


