Dear Parishioners,

Many of you have supported the St. Julie-St. Peter Welcome Circle for the last 15 months. The Bryiovsky family needs a different kind of assistance now. When they came to the United States in the fall of 2023, the Byriovsky's and other Ukrainians were granted a legal standing in the United States called Humanitarian Parole. Some of the changes to our Immigration policies jeopardized this status. Please see the article later in this bulletin directing us to contact our representatives and ask them to protect their status.

I am inviting you to join me on a pilgrimage to Italy during this Jubilee Year. It is a special year for the Universal Church as well as for St. Peter Parish which is celebration its 150th Anniversary. The pilgrimage is entitled Shrines of Italy. Besides visiting the four major basilicas of Rome (St. Peter, St. Mary Major, St. John Lateran, and St. Paul Outside the Walls), we will tour the Sistine Chapel and Vatican Museum. And if we plan things right, we might be able to incorporate the Scavi Tour, the tour underneath St. Peter's, that takes one to the place where St. Peter was buried. The tour will also include a visit to Monte Cassino, where St. Benedict and St. Scholastica (his sister) lived and were buried. The tour will also include time in Assisi (home of St. Francis, St. Clare and soon to be St. Carlos Acutis) and San Giovanni Rotundo, the home of St. Padre Pio.

Our Ukrainian Welcome Circle and the Bryiovskyis need your help!

There have been a number of Executive Orders in the last week or so addressing Immigration. UWC Members have been in these Zoom meetings as legal representatives of the United States Council of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) have provided insights into the impact of the Executive Orders. They also provided guidance regarding what information to share with our families. They also have provided recommendations about how to share. We have met with the Bryiovskyis and reviewed in detail everything we have so far. What they had heard made them fearful and the meeting helped to lessen some of that fear. We will continue to follow all updates and proceed as recommended. This is the short summary.

Even though the Bryiovskyis came to the US legally under Humanitarian Parole, some of the proposed changes to Immigration could put their legal status in jeopardy. Our family is currently working with an immigration lawyer to find options as are many of the other families who came to northeast Ohio sponsored by other parishes.

Everyone is doing fine. Susiana turned 4 and they had a great Christmas, thanks to all of the donations we received. They were able to spend some time with Vitalii's brother and his family as well as Nadiia's sister and her family.

This week Vitalii took the test to get his learner permit for CDL (truck driving). He passed! This is the first step to get him into CDL training. Now he will be able to apply for the full training course. So, Vitalii is now "negotiating with his boss" to take time off to complete the training. He's hoping to start soon. The process will likely take 2-3 months.

Now that our new administration is in office, we will need to keep a close eye on any changes to immigration policies as they relate to the program under which the Bryiovskyis came.
